Opportunities – Alaska District

- IDIQs for engineering, design & environmental services
 - ▶ Numerous IDIQ contracts - varying expiration dates and capacities
 - ▶ Several new and replacement actions in various stages of acquisition with emphasis on AE and Environmental Services support
- Design-Build Contracts
 - ▶ South East Asia DB Contracts - Offered to construction/engineering firms with the intent to develop organic capacity in the host nation
 - ▶ Small Works DB Contracts – New and replacement tools to support SRM requirements in Alaska for Military and non-Military clients alike
- Environmental A-E
 - ▶ Small Business A-E (2 contracts); \$7M each, 5 years
 - ▶ Unrestricted A-E (3 contracts); \$12M each, 5 years
- Environmental Remediation Services (includes FUDS)
 - ▶ Unrestricted Services MATOC \$250M, 5 years



- FY14 ended w/35 projects and \$16.5M.
- Working with PACOM to prepare the FY15 program. 25 total projects.

Opportunities – Honolulu District

 - ▶ 21 IDIQ contracts with varying expiration dates and capacities
 - ▶ 8(a) DBB/DB MATOC for NSA
- Environmental
 - ▶ Environmental Services
 - Small Business POD Regional MATOC \$35M, 5 years
 - Environmental (MEC) SATOC \$95M, 5 years
 - Cultural Resources and Related Investigations \$9.5M, 5 years

Opportunities - Korea

- Utilizes Status of Forces Agreement (SOFA) A-E's for most engineering and design services
 - ▶ Three US SOFA A-E firms with presence in Korea. No new firms on the horizon.
 - ▶ SOFA A-E firms sub-contract for specialized services
 - ▶ Seek opportunities to team with SOFA A-E firms
- SCIFs
 - ▶ Two SCIFs remaining to be contracted separately - designed by SOFA A-E firms
 - ▶ Construction open to U.S. cleared firms
 - ▶ Security Monitoring Service Contract open to U.S. cleared firms will be synopsized
 - ▶ Can apply for SOFA “Invited Contractor Status” after award

Opportunities - Japan

- Utilizes Japanese A-E firms and US A-E firms with Japanese partners or subcontractors for engineering and design services
 - ▶ 25 IDIQ Contracts with varying expiration dates and capacities
 - Includes 4 US A-E IDIQ Contracts which are primarily used for the DoDEA program in Japan
 - ▶ Planning on a US A-E IDIQ for DoDEA work later this FY
- Environmental Services
 - ▶ MATOC \$9M, 5 years and open only to firms licensed in Japan

Qualifications - Japan A-Es

- Typical selection criteria:
 - Experience in preparing U.S. funded design drawings, specifications, and cost estimates for the repair, maintenance, antiterrorism/force protection, and construction of facilities on U.S. military installations located in Japan.
 - Experience in the Host Nation (HN) funded construction program, Facilities Improvement Program (FIP) or relocation projects, specifically, preparation of criteria packages for HN projects.
 - Experience with Japanese design and construction practices, materials, procedures, standards, criteria and codes.
- How to get design experience in Japan
 - Partner with Japanese A-E firms
 - Create a Joint Venture
